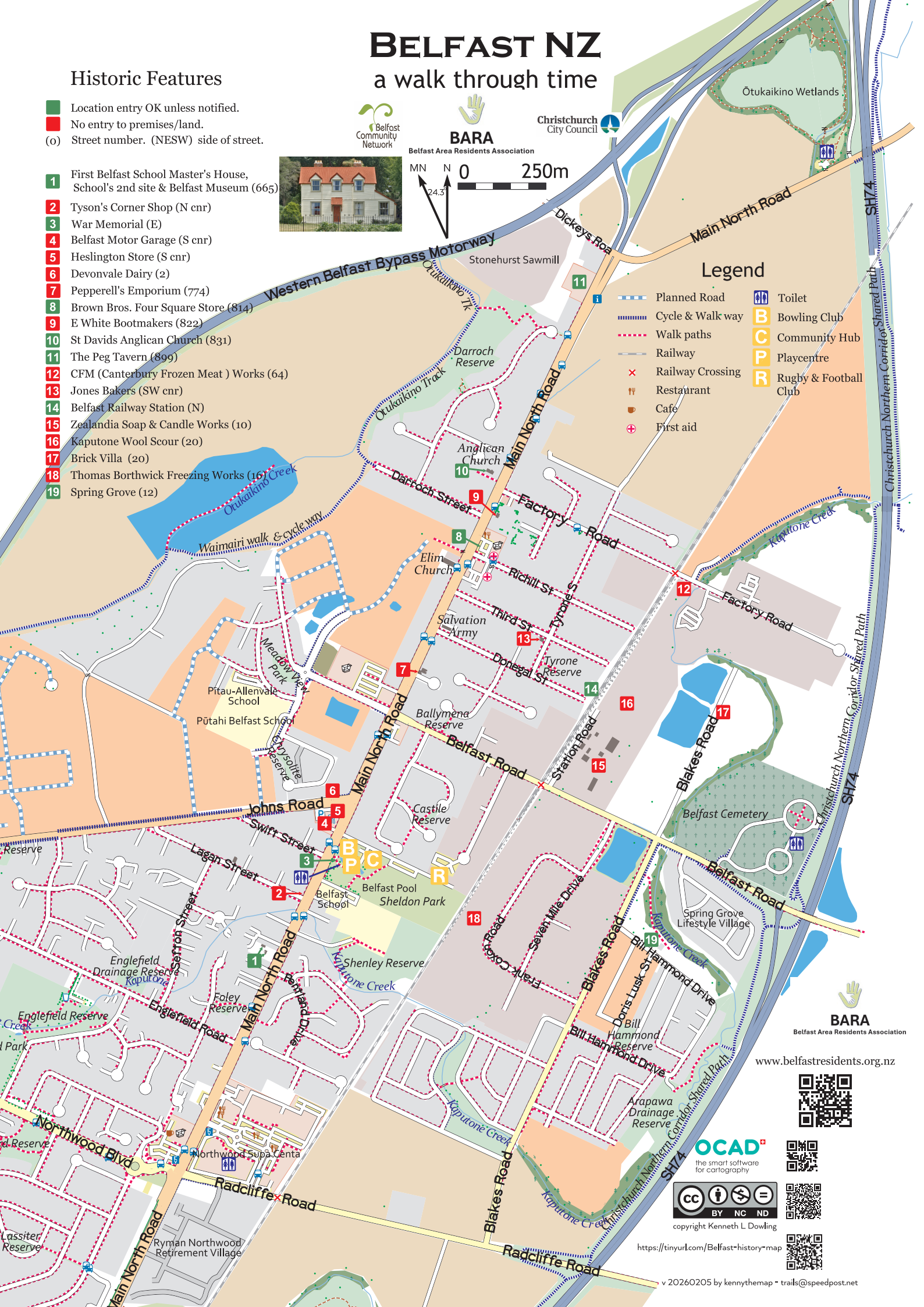

HISTORIC FEATURES OF BELFAST 'A WALK THROUGH TIME' MAP

- 1. First Belfast School Master's House & Belfast Museum** – Built 1877; housed staff until 1972. Museum (1985) preserves local artefacts.
- 2. Tysons Corner Shop (1923–1940)** – Bill Williams served milk to locals on his bike and Tyson family pictured, lived at 59 Radcliffe Road.
- 3. War Memorial** – a brown Glentunnel stone pillar (1921) with seven plaques commemorating WWI & WWII servicemen.
- 4. Belfast Motor Garage** – 1920s featured the Cannon & Son garage on Main North Road.
- 5. Heslington Store** – Opened 1891; also served as a telegraph and telephone office on a 43 hectare block.
- 6. Devonvale Dairy** – Founded 1908 by Andrew & James Johns; early milk pasteurisation; demolished 1980s.
- 7. Pepperell's Emporium** – Circa 1902, this store sold a variety of goods including tobacco.
- 8. Brown Bros. Four Square Store** – Founded 1882, Belfast's largest general store; continued by Annie Brown; supermarket opened 1967.
- 9. E White Bootmakers** – Built 1911; Mr White was well known for his "No Tick Here" clock (now in Belfast Museum). The building was relocated to the Ferrymead Historic Park in 1992.
- 10. St David's Anglican Church** – Opened 1903; it was an early Arts & Crafts church designed by Samuel Hurst Seager; replaced c.1955.
- 11. The Peg Tavern** – Originally Belfast Bridge Inn (1870s); named for being seven miles from Christchurch Post Office, a common form of measurement at the time.
- 12. CFM Works & Engine House** – 1883, Canterbury's first meat export facility; *Edwin Fox* used as temporary freezer; now operating as Silver Fern Farms.
- 13. Jones Bakers** – Operating 1917; a popular bakery known for morning bread aroma.
- 14. Belfast Railway Station** – Opened 1872, prize winning gardens were maintained by Norm Chapple. It provided a passenger service 1976–79 and was demolished shortly after decommissioning.
- 15. Zealandia Soap & Candle Works** – Circa 1900; used animal fat by-products to create and export soap and candles. In 1938 there was a large fire which destroyed factory.
- 16. Kaputone Wool Scour** – Founded 1903; employed 70 local residents and was a very popular employer hosting the community Wool Workers' Picnic in 1913.
- 17. Brick Villa** – Home of the CFM engineer Mr Anderson; square-plan villa reflecting classic 1920's design. This is a heritage protected building.
- 18. Thomas Borthwick Freezing Works** – 1870s Thomas was a pioneer of frozen meat trade; often having friendly Rugby matches between the two meat works of Belfast. TBFW & C.F.M. merged 1974–75 with Belfast handling beef and pigs and CFM handling lamb and mutton. With TBFW later being decommissioned in the 1990's.
- 19. Spring Grove** – William Nichols (1851–1920) farmed 100 acres; ran Kaputone Works; donated 8 acres forming Sheldon Park. This is a heritage protected building.
